Purpose:

The impact of substance use on transplant evaluation and outcomes is complex with many medical, psychiatric, and ethical considerations. The severity of a patient's medical illness may be readily characterized but when a history of a substance use disorder enters the picture (tobacco, opioids, marijuana, alcohol, etc.), determining a candidate's suitability for transplantation becomes more challenging. During this webinar, we will discuss the intricacies of substance use disorders and how they intersect with the process of organ transplantation before and after the procedure. Our speakers include an addiction medicine specialist who will present best addiction treatment practices emphasizing their relevance to transplant recipients.
